Why are we running Enrichment Days?



Student Behaviour

Naturally, we expect students to behave on Enrichment Days as well as they would do during a normal school day, and this is no exception.

In previous trips, we have often been complimented by venues or coach companies on how well our students have conducted themselves; this leads us onto repeat bookings and a desire from these companies to work with us again. However, as a preventative measure, it is necessary to point out that any unacceptable behaviour will result in students being withdrawn from activities. In such cases, a refund will NOT be possible as most bookings have to be paid for in advance.

We welcome applications from all Year 7-9 students, but, in exceptional circumstances, it may be that a student is refused a place on safeguarding grounds. We are not willing to jeopardise the enjoyment or safety of any child on any activity and have to make sure each and every child is safeguarded appropriately.

Attendance

Enrichment Week is not optional! Attendance is compulsory, whether you are involved in one of the offsite activities or not. Those students who are not involved in an offsite activity will still be provided with an onsite activity. We value enrichment and believe it is a fundamental part of your child's education.

Free School Meals

If your child is currently in receipt of Free School Meals, for activities based locally, we will provide them with a 'grab bag' for any off-site visits.





Choosing an Activity

Please read through all the activity details. Some activities are off site; some require early departures and/or may return to school later than usual. It is important that students can make their way to and from school safely to meet the requirements of the activity.

Places will be allocated on a first come, first served basis and it is compulsory that we obtain the appropriate off-site consent form in order to accept and process your application. All activity/event packages are three days, unless otherwise stated.

Key Dates

Friday, January 31: the brochure will be sent to students' and parents/carers email addresses.

Monday, February 3: we will send the link for the Google form to students in Year 7, 8 and 9. We will also send a message home via MCAS to let you know when the form has been sent.

Please bear with us whilst we process the forms, we will endeavour to confirm your place ASAP.

You will only be able to submit the form once so you can complete it that evening with them or they can do it during tutor time on the February 4 and 5, providing an opportunity for them to complete the Google form using our computer facilities with help from their Tutor if needed. Obviously this does bring with it different challenges; it is not in student's best interests to sign up for a trip they do not have their parent consent for so it would be great to look through the website and discuss this together before completing the form.

Any incomplete/missing forms cannot be processed. Your child's space/s will be confirmed to you as soon as possible following the submission of these forms and we will then launch the payments on the MCAS App in 'Trips' (further information will be in the confirmation email/letter).

In due course, the trip leader will write to you informing you of any specific arrangements. Some trips may require a parents' meeting and you will be informed of this by the trip leader. At present, all trips will depart and arrive back to Lipson Co-operative Academy. Please ensure you have arranged for your child to get to and from school safely.

Payments

In response to the current climate and increasing costs, we have tried to ease the financial burden of enrichment week by subsidising the trips on offer. This has enabled us to offer them to you at the lowest possible cost.

There will be a payment plan for each paid activity of £16 or more, so please ensure you meet those deadlines, which will be outlined in your activity allocation letter. A deposit will be required to secure your place on the chosen activity by Monday, February 10. Failure to make the payments on time will result in the removal from your chosen activity and re-allocation to a free onsite activity.

All payments are non-refundable and, as stated above, your deposit will be required to secure your child's place.

All payments should be made on your MCAS (My Child At School) account. If, for any reason, a trip does not reach full capacity, there is a possibility it will be cancelled, and you will be offered an alternative trip or a refund.

Please note, if you change your mind at any point and cancel your trip, you may not get a refund. As we progress closer to enrichment week, we will be making payments to the suppliers involved in the running of the activities.

We will do our best to find someone to take your place on the trip, but if this isn't possible, you will still be required to pay and could be prevented from going on future paid trips.







Basic swimming skills will be required.





Day 1 South West SUP

Meet at Royal William Yard for 9am and dismissed at 3pm.



















MN5 LASER TAG AND BOWLING
