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

Careers - To date we have submitted Six UCAS applications, including three Oxbridge Applications for students wishing to gain a place at Oxford or Cambridge. **Vocational** - We have enjoyed welcoming our new year 12 students and our Year 13s. Currently we have students studying at Achievement Training College and Discovery College with a wide range of subjects being taken at different levels, including Travel & Tourism, Health & Social Care, Beauty Therapy, Sport, Public Services, Animal Care, Business and Childcare & Education. The Vocational Program is another educational pathway to achieve career goals and gain a high level of education and experience with practical hands-on elements and placements in a work setting. Additionally, several of these courses have a degree pathway with students attending university and degree apprenticeships.
